experience.

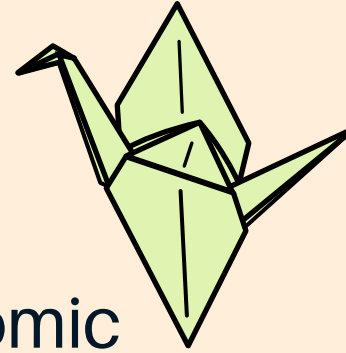
Moving to Singapore
